We offer a range of activities that promote fun, friendship, independence, and collaborative play. This is facilitated under the guidance of qualified and experienced educators.


Some of the activities that children have already participated in include jelly making, playdough making, seed planting, arts, and crafts, as well as a range of indoor and outdoor games and activities.
