On **13 February 2008** Prime Minister Kevin Rudd made a formal apology to Australia's Indigenous peoples, particularly to the Stolen Generations whose lives had been blighted by past government policies of forced child removal and Indigenous assimilation.

In this landmark speech, the Government called on all Australians to reflect on the past actions that form an important part of our history. The apology included a resolve to embrace new solutions to enduring problems where old approaches had failed, and a future based on mutual respect and mutual responsibility.

RESPECT..RESPECT...RESPECT

We will not be having ALPHA this year. Instead, we are going to concentrate on our school rules of RESPECT – **Respect for yourself, Respect for others and Respect for our environment.** The ALPHA traits fit into this and we thought it would be good to connect in with these and acknowledge how important it is to follow these rules as they should underpin everything that we do at school. Classroom teachers will talk to students about what they think each of these mean and put up a chart in their classroom to remind them.

Each week their teacher will decide whether students have followed our 3Rs and will allocate points depending on how well they have followed them. These points will go towards their House (red, yellow or blue) and at the end of the term we will count up how many points there are for each house. The winning house will get to wear their house colours on our celebration day and will receive a trophy to keep for the term. We think that this will also promote pride in their House and ensure that the House system encompasses more that sport.
