#### CHILD SAFETY -HAVE YOU HAD THE TALK?

Often it is difficult to broach conversations about personal safety with your child or children but it is our job, as adults, to keep them safe and we need to equip them with the skills and knowledge to know what is okay and not okay in terms of consent and their own body. There are excellent resources out there that help parents have these conversations at an age appropriate level. Included with this newsletter are two such resources: one from the Daniel Morecombe Foundation about 'Talking Personal Safety' and the other from Parenting Ideas called 'Body Safety and Consent'. These articles are from reputable sources and can assist parents with what and how much to say and when. One of the most important things you can do as a parent is keep the communication open with your child.
