St Mary of the Cross MacKillop and the Josephite sisters set up schools in Australia and New Zealand. They also set up houses for elderly women, young girls and women without jobs. They gave their life to people in need often giving comfort to the sick and dying and even visiting people in jail to give them whatever help they could.

Throughout the year we will be looking at the life and work of Mary MacKillop and the Josephite sisters (who founded our school). St Mary of the Cross is a terrific role model for

our lives. She was the model of an independent woman who showed great strength and persistence, dedicating her life to the promotion of justice for all and education for everyone, especially in small towns that might not otherwise have a school.

We will also be connecting with our local Parish story and are excited about finding out about the history of both the church and the school.

Families are always welcome to attend assembly. We will notify you if there is no assembly for the week sometimes things come up and we need to postpone it. The Mary MacKillop Award is also presented at assembly but it isn't necessarily every week. The Mary MacKillop

award is given to students who show the qualities of Mary MacKillop in their actions. At the end of the year the recipients of this award are invited to a special lunch with the Principal. We had 14 students who received this award last year.

DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY

In Digital Technology with Mrs Bayliss, we have started with being safe online and being an ethical user of technology. It is so important for children to understand what to do if they see something that makes them feel uncomfortable and know what they can and can't share online. It is also important that they think about ethics in an online space and don't cause hurt or harm to anyone else.

UNIFORM & SPORTS DAYS

Sports days for this term are **Monday** and **Wednesday** so these are the only days where students can wear their sports uniform. If your child is out of uniform, please notify their classroom teacher of the reason. Just a reminder that in terms 1 and 4 hats are compulsory, although we would encourage students to wear their hats all year. Please monitor your child and their uniform throughout the year and make sure they are wearing the correct uniform. Our school rules of RESPECT include respecting yourself and a part of that is presenting yourself well and wearing the uniform with pride.

SWIMMING

The swimming program commences for students in Years 3-6 on Monday. There will be 9 swimming lessons and

then on Monday, 20th February we have our whole school swimming carnival. Students are encouraged to wear their house colours on the carnival day. The P-2 swimming program will be in Term 2 at Kemp Aquatics in Maffra.



CLASS NEWSLETTERS

You should have received a class newsletter this week (next Monday if you haven't received it already). Each newsletter will outline important features and expectations of your child's class. All grades will be using Class Dojo again this year to enhance communication between home and school. We strongly recommend that you sign up when you receive the information—it is a simple and easy way to keep in contact with your child's teacher.



Please be aware that during the

school day, classroom teachers do not have time to check and/or respond to Dojo messages as they are too busy teaching. Please ring the office if you have a message to pass on.

GETTING THE MESSAGE ACROSS

Maintaining efficient communication is crucial within a school community. Currently we have the newsletter, the website, the phone app. and email. The newsletter will be uploaded regularly to the website and on the app. The newsletter is also emailed out to all families every second Friday. Calendar dates are recorded on the newsletter, website and app.

The P & F Facebook page is not part of the school's official communication. It is to keep you up to speed with what the P & F are doing and connected with other parents. Notifications will not be sent out via Facebook.

REMINDER ABOUT THE SCHOOL APP

This is just a reminder to everyone to make sure that you have the school app on your phones. In an emergency, the app allows us to quickly send out important information to our whole school community.

PARKING ZONE REMINDER

At drop off and pick up times, please make sure not to park in the area between the sign posts at the Davis Street entrance to the School. **This area is reserved for School buses only** and if a car is parked there it makes it difficult for the bus to deliver and pick up the students in a safe manner.





If you park on Davis Street to collect your children, it is also important to park on the school side of the road. Davis Street is far too busy at pick up time and children should <u>not</u> be crossing the road on their own. Children are to remain inside the school grounds until they are collected by a parent/carer.

TIMBER FESTIVAL

FINANCIAL CONCESSIONS

Financial concessions are available to eligible families. It is important to note, when concessions are provided, there is no impact on the overall school funding situation.

These concessions may include the Camps Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) of \$125 per child. Concessions are available through the following two categories.

Category 1: Eligible, means-tested Centrelink Concession Card holders:

A family in which the fee payer holds an eligible, meanstested Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) is automatically eligible for a school fee concession. There is a simplified application form and streamlined approval process.

Category 2: Special Consideration:

A family experiencing genuine financial difficulty and not eligible under Category 1, is encouraged to apply for a fee concession. This application requires detailed information in order that an equitable assessment may be made of eligibility for and level of a fee concession.

Application forms are available from the school office and only need to be completed if this is a new application. Current concession holders do not need to reapply.





What's the best way to support your child during transitions at school?



Whether it is starting school for the first time, moving up to a higher grade or embarking on a journey through secondary school, there is no doubt that any school transition is a very exciting time for children and parents. It means your children are growing up!

However, transitioning is an ongoing process. It can continue long after students have entered their new environment and may encounter difficulties at a number of different stages. These stressors may appear as anxiety and frustration and result in negative or disruptive behaviours. Such behaviours can become problematic making the transitioning process even more difficult for children and parents.

In this edition of SchoolTV, parents will learn practical strategies to assist your child during the transition process and reduce stress and anxiety levels.

We hope you take time to reflect on the information offered in this edition of SchoolTV and we always welcome your feedback. If you have any concerns about your child, please contact the school principal for further information or seek medical or professional help.



CATASTROPHIC FIRE DANGER DAYS: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

St Michael's PS is now on the Bushfire At Risk Register (BARR) which means that we are required to close on days rated as 'Catastrophic Fire Danger'. This was previously called a 'Code Red' day. Determined by the Emergency Management Commissioner, a Code Red/Catastrophic fire danger day is the highest level of Fire Danger Rating and signifies the worst conditions for bushfire and grassfires.

These are our Bushfire/Grassfire Emergency Response Procedures for Code Red/Catastrophic fire danger Days

- St Michael's School will **close** on days declared *Code Red/Catastrophic fire danger*.
- Where possible, three days' notice of a planned closure will be provided. However, experience indicates that a *Code Red/Catastrophic fire danger day* fire danger rating day may be forecast at short notice. Parents and guardians should expect that in some instances less than three days' notice may be provided.
- Once the final decision to close is confirmed at 12 noon the day prior, this decision will not change – regardless of any changes in the weather forecast. This will help limit confusion and help families plan for how their children will be cared for when their school is closed.
- Notice of a 'code red/Catastrophic fire danger' closure will be provided via the school app and email.
- When a school is closed in response to bushfire risk, no one, including staff, contractors and other users, will be permitted on site.
