It's been a great week everyone. We





Bushfire At-Risk Register Schools (BARR)

Pre-emptive Closure of the school Response Steps

Bushfire/Grassfire Specific Emergency Response Procedures

Code Red/Catastrophic fire danger Days

St Michael's School will close on days declared Code Red/Catastrophic fire danger.

Where possible, three days' notice of a planned closure will be provided. However, experience indicates that a Code Red/Catastrophic fire danger day fire danger rating day may be forecast at short notice. Parents and guardians should expect that in some instances less than three days' notice may be provided.

Once the final decision to close is confirmed at 12 noon the day prior, this decision will not change – regardless of any changes in the weather forecast. This will help limit confusion and help families plan for how their children will be cared for when their school is closed.

Notice of a 'code red/Catastrophic fire danger' closure will be provided via the school app and email.

When a school is closed in response to bushfire risk, no one, including staff, contractors and other users, will be permitted on site.

A bushfire/grassfire is observable or identified via VicEmergency App within 20km from the school.

And/or

There is an Advice, Watch and Act or Emergency Warning area for the fire that includes your school.

Shelter in place with threat of bushfire:

Option 1 - Church (this is the only brick building on site)

Option 2 – School ICT Room (if it is unsafe to leave the building)

Contact parents: via School App, SMS Message from school phone, Dojo

Immediate Actions

If immediate emergency services assistance is required call '000'.

Convene your Incident Management Team (IMT).

Report the incident to DOSCEL Secretariat Emergency Management Officer on 03 5622 6603 or 0417 534 695.

If your school is in an Emergency Warning area and the warning states that it is too late to leave then shelter in place and seek further advice.

If your school is in a Watch and Act warning area then seek advice and then decide whether to:

remain on site and monitor conditions or shelter in place, call parents to pick their children up, evacuate the school to your offsite bushfire evacuation location.

If your school is in an Advice Warning area then seek further advice and monitor conditions as they may change.

This week's article will be about the words you might be hearing in the news and other places, you might not know what they mean. So e will be doing a glossary of Environmental related words.

Environment- All the natural physical surroundings on Earth are called the environment.
