PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

As we enter the last week of term before the Easter holiday break, I want to say a big thank you to all students, families and staff members for the effort everyone has put into Term 1. A special mention to our Grade Prep students that have just completed their first term of schooling. This week the school had CCTV installed around the outside of the building. In recent years, works have been undertaken in DOSCEL primary schools to enhance physical security of the school sites through installation of access control systems locks and upgrades to school fencing. The next stage of these security improvements for all DOSCEL schools focuses on ensuring suitable CCTV and alarm systems are in place at each school. By addressing dated security and CCTV systems, the installation project aims to not only improve physical security but also compliance with data retention and cybersecurity.


